SZABIST University Sustainable Development Research and Training Center (SDRTC) in collaboration with Friedrich Naumann Foundation (FNF) held an expert discussion and film screening on "Indus River: A Confluence of Economy and Culture" on Monday, 8<sup>th</sup> May, 2023. The session was attended by **academicians** and **representatives of various NGOs**.

One of the cross cutting theme of this discussion was Water governance, which remains a challenging area of Pakistani sociopolitical context. A short film was also screened to state the miseries of riverine communities and the prevalent water sharing and managing among the provinces at large.

Speaking on the occasion, **Ms. Birgit Lamm, Country Head FNF Pakistan**, said that nobody could have ever lived in this region without Indus that gives life and livelihood to the people of Pakistan. She said that this film shares an adventure and travel story of Wajahat Malik, director of film, who wanted to travel Indus on raft from North to all the way to South and it also triggers a debate on problems and challenges of Indus.

Ms. Sanaa Baxamoosa, Director External Relations Hisaar Foundation, said that intrinsic value that people should have for Indus is lost. She said that films of these kind are need of the hour which can help change the narrative. She said that Indus is our lifeline and holistic approach is required to look at Indus River beyond dams, irrigation system and administrative units.

**Dr. Hassan Abbas**, an expert on hydrology and water resources, said that one of the biggest obstacle is lack of understanding of the river system at highest policy level who only see river with the lens of engineers. He said that megastructure and diversions planned during the Indus River Treaty has destroyed the river system.

**Prof. Aijaz Qureshi, Educationist & Development Professional**, said that issue of governance and distribution of land around Indus has also caused people to suffer.





#### Tribal conflicts in Sindh continue to have devastating effects on women, seminar told

As women lack education and financial autonomy in underprivileged areas of Sindh, they often face more financial and psychological stress in case of tribal conflicts.

This was stated by speakers at a seminar titled 'Tribal Conflicts and Impact on Women' organised by the Women's Action Forum (WAF) in collaboration with Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto Institute of Science and Technology (Szabist).

The event was moderated by Kausar S Khan, a member of the WAF's four-member delegation that visited Sukkur, Kashmore and Ghotki districts to gain a deeper understanding of the underlying factors contributing to tribal conflicts and their impact on women.

In the observance of International Day of Poverty, SZABIST University Sustainable Development Research and Training Center (SDRTC) organized a Panel Discussion "From Poverty to Progress: Navigating Economic Challenges" on November 8, 2023 targeting SDG 1 and SDG 8. The panel was moderated by Dr. Kaiser Bengali. The speakers included Asad Ali Shah, Former Advisor to Chief Minister Sindh on Sindh and Dr. Asma Hyder, Dean School of Economics and Social Sciences IBA.

Speaking on the occasion Asad Ali Shah said that large government in proportion to our expenditure is the reason of unproductive economy. He said that investment in the human capital and robust ecosystem of entrepreneurship are the two important factors in the development of any country. Dr. Asma Hyder said that pandemic, conflicts, climate change and migration are the reasons of poverty. In order to reduce the poverty, the wealth should be distributed equally through transfer of assets such as programs like Benazir Income Support Program, livestock and capacity building of individuals so that they can generate income.

The Public Health Department at SZABIST University organized the inaugural Public Health

Symposium titled "Health Systems Performance and Lessons Learned: 2022 Floods" on May 20, 2023, at the SZABIST Auditorium.

Dr. Sameera Ali Rizvi extended a warm welcome to the esteemed guests and students in attendance. Professor Dr. Mehtab Karim, a distinguished faculty member from the Public Health Department at SZABIST, shed light on the rapid growth of the population as a manmade disaster in Pakistan. He underscored that Pakistan's population is expanding at a rate of 2.5 percent, significantly surpassing neighboring countries



and other low-income nations. Professor Karim posed critical questions regarding how Pakistan intends to effectively manage this population growth alongside the challenges posed by climate change.

Dr. Zaib Dahar, a senior technical advisor at Pathfinder, emphasized the heightened vulnerability of women and children as one of the most affected groups during disasters. The Covid-19 pandemic and recent floods exacerbated the decline in institutional deliveries and family planning services due to a lack of prioritization. The focus shifted to life-saving transportation and outbreak control, neglecting essential maternal and child health (MCH) services and family planning. Because of the floods, approximately one-third of healthcare facilities were forced to close. Alarmingly, in the camps, 61% of women with children under the age of two were not



utilizing any family planning methods. Communities and healthcare staff were ill prepared to address the emergency, leading to the failure to execute contingency plans and resorting to crisis management strategies.

Dr. Sara Salman from the World Health Organization (WHO) in Sindh discussed the strategies employed to mitigate the destruction of healthcare services. Initially, the focus was on rescue operations, service reparation, and



community support, followed by rehabilitation, repair, and renovation efforts. Nutrition emerged as a major concern, alongside mental health issues, within the affected communities. More than 50% of health facilities were damaged, impacting service provision and accessibility to life-saving resources and referral networks. WHO is dedicated to strengthening primary healthcare and implementing a person-focused approach to achieve universal health coverage, with Sindh being the first province in this endeavor. WHO supported the establishment of mobile labor rooms, immunization services, and primary healthcare facilities, including the provision of vaccinations in the camps. Emergency operations cells were established in Hyderabad, Thatta, Larkana, and Sukkur to ensure the delivery of integrated services and access to clean water. Doorstep delivery of food packages was also provided. WHO is actively supporting telemedicine and psychosocial support initiatives, while the rehabilitation of services continues to be an ongoing priority.

Dr. Talib Lashari talked about a case for climate resilient Health System. He highlighted that there is surge / re-emergence of infectious diseases/communicable diseases, non-communicable diseases along with mental illnesses because of climate change. Sindh is one of the most severally affected area due to drought, dry spells, heavy rains, floods, urban flooding, cyclones, migration, lack of irrigation water, unsafe drinking water etc. He added that government has developed a framework for climate resilient health system. We need to prepare and respond now.



We cannot address health in isolation; it is part of social determinants of health. Based on six building blocks of health systems, we need leadership and governance mechanisms, integrated data systems and need to link finance with climate response. He emphasized that district level health plans need to be developed and implemented.

During the symposium, Dr. Farid Midhat from the audience shared an alarming observation regarding climate change. He mentioned that even a 5% increase in temperature before childbirth has resulted in an increase in stillbirths and



premature deliveries, which remains a constant concern for Pakistan. Dr. Sarwat emphasized the critical role of women's empowerment in responding effectively to the current climate challenges.

The Director-General of Health stressed the significance of fieldwork for public health workers while discussing the impact of rain and floods in 2022. He reported that over 10 million people were affected in 24 districts due to the floods last year. Approximately 1,000 health facilities were submerged and damaged. He highlighted the government's response through the deployment of medical camps, healthcare workers, and the continuation of routine immunization services. The major lesson learned from this experience was the power of synergy and collective action. Despite their own homes and families being affected by the floods, healthcare workers selflessly assisted those in need. The Director-General expressed gratitude to all government workers, NGOs, INGOs, including AKU, UNICEF, UNFPA, WHO, and the general public for their support and collaboration.

Dr. Syed Aziz Rab, the Chief Executive Officer of Green Star Marketing, delivered a comprehensive presentation addressing the intricate challenges associated with the supply chain for health commodities, specifically focusing on contraceptives. Recognizing the significance of collaborating with governmental entities, Dr. Rab emphasized the government's extensive outreach capabilities to target large segments of the population effectively. In order to achieve



health indicators and targets, innovative ideas are essential, considering that population growth continues to pose a significant issue despite ongoing efforts spanning multiple decades. Dr. Rab drew attention to the alarming rise in the number of abortions due to a high prevalence of unwanted pregnancies. Shockingly, despite the devastating toll, which amounts to the loss of 1,400 women's lives every month, these tragic occurrences often fail to garner media coverage. Disruptions within the supply chain, particularly for food and menstrual hygiene products, were also highlighted. Even in such challenging circumstances, the private sector demonstrated resilience and reached

out to address the needs of affected communities. Therefore, it is imperative to incentivize and mobilize both the private sector and other private networks to effectively respond to emergencies. Dr. Rab further elucidated the hurdles associated with developing and importing health commodities, exemplifying the burden imposed by the 18% import duty on condoms.



Dr. Karim Khuwaja delivered a comprehensive discourse addressing the escalating prevalence of mental health challenges resulting from floods, the COVID-19 pandemic, and other calamities. He presented findings from a study conducted in the Thar region, which involved the use of psychological autopsies. Dr. Khuwaja further elaborated on the collaborative efforts undertaken by the Sindh Mental Health Authority in conjunction with numerous universities and organizations such as IMCI. These endeavors encompassed the establishment of camps and the provision of psychosocial services during and after floods. To ensure widespread accessibility,



three helplines were established to extend support to individuals in need. Moreover, a total of three hundred healthcare professionals were trained across various areas, including Sanghar, Badin, and Sukkar, to administer mental health services.

The symposium concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Batool Fatima. Madam Shahnaz expressed gratitude to the esteemed guests while presenting them with commemorative

shields. Approximately 80 students, faculty members, and guests attended the symposium from SZBIST.



Deaf Reach, a program of the Family Educational Services Foundation, is working to meet the great need for Deaf education in Pakistan. MS-ELM students trained Deaf Reach teachers with interactive emerging technologies integration helped their day-to-day teaching practices, and also inculcated social-emotional learning teaching practices for students to manage their anxieties and to make them feel included as an important part of society by ensuring the incorporation of the resources used in the mainstream education and providing them with opportunities to exhibit their exceptional skills and talents. Our students used Kotter's 8-Step Change Model to provide a structured approach to implementing this initiative effectively as their change management project at Deaf Reach Schools in Pakistan.

#### d) Change Management

This change management project was done under Ms. Sadiya Durrani's supervision using Kotter's 8-step model. It aimed to empower teachers at Government Girls Primary School in Khudada Colony by training them to integrate critical thinking activities as icebreakers and warm-up exercises. Our vision statement was: "Empowering minds with critical thinking and fueling the passion for lifelong learning." Initially, we conducted a needs analysis to understand the importance of critical thinking skills as a warm-up in the classroom. Then we formed a coalition of teachers to lead the change, ensuring active participation from senior stakeholders. We provided proper, step-by-step training to bring about the desired changes. During the training sessions, participants were introduced to various critical thinking activities, complemented by classroom demonstrations. This hands-on approach facilitated a thorough understanding and offered comprehensive guidance. As the project progressed, we empowered teachers through micro-teaching and reflective practices, preparing them for effective classroom instruction, gearing their confidence, and peerto-peer evaluation. After this, the teachers were encouraged to plan for classroom demonstrations of the critical thinking activities, our team observed the teachers, witnessed their efforts, and recognized them for their efforts through certificates and gifts for Best Lesson Delivery and Best Critical Thinking Activity. Continuous monitoring and support were provided throughout the project. Ultimately, teachers, along with their principal and coordinator, were encouraged to sustain these practices after the holidays. They were also invited to share short videos demonstrating their application of critical thinking activities in the classroom, equipping students with essential skills for future success. To evaluate the impact of



our training, we conducted pre- and post-surveys from teachers and assessed the result through quantitative analysis paired sample test. Furthermore, we interviewed students about their learning experiences after they experienced their teachers' initiative in the classroom. This feedback was crucial in assessing the effectiveness of the new strategies
















#### D. SZABIST Student Clubs/Societies

The SSC has been engaged in initiating wide range of meaningful activities ranging from intellectual programs to competitive sporting events. Among the most notable is the annual LEAD Convention, where SSC provides a platform to the young leaders, from all universities across the city, to contemplate over the global issues that require sustainable yet immediate solutions.

To offer a vibrant and healthy students environment at SZABIST, the SSC also arranges the Annual Orientation to welcome the new students, Beach Party, Musical Concert, Mehfil-e-Mushaira, Qawwali night, Graduation Week and many more other entertaining events.

SSC, being a proactive student body, engages in community services to inculcate a responsible citizenship behavior among students. In this regard, the SSC has signed MoUs with different organizations and NGOs to contribute in various noble causes. Urban Forest and The ELF (Environmental Leaders Forum) are two such MoUs where the SSC is practically engaged in environmental protection and conservation through trainings, awareness programs, fundraisers, students' projects and other healthy activities.

The SSC has also joined hands with the Ismail Industries Foundation for reducing the use of plastic on campus. In collaboration with the Ismail Foundation, special bins have been placed across all campuses to collect plastic on a daily basis. Burns Centre is another organization, the SSC and Rotaract Club of Karachi Campus have vowed to work for.

Under this MoU, the students of SZABIST contribute to spread awareness among masses related to managing injuries due to burns and their precautions. Further, SSC has also extended help to the countrymen whenever there is a need in times of national crisis like the flood disaster in the year 2022.

#### Structure of SSC 1

The SSC is an elected student body that is comprised of the Executive Branch (EB), Council of Common Interests (or Program Representatives), General Body and Societies Committee.

The Executive Branch of the SSC consists of elected members to serve as President, Vice President, General Secretary, Treasurer, Secretary Legal, Secretary Operations, Secretary Resource Mobilization, Secretary Media and Communication and Secretary Projects and Training.

#### The Five Pillars of SSC

The SSC and all its student associations and clubs fall under the purview of and are registered with, the Office of Student Advisory once they are formed. The SSC has 5 thematic pillars, under which different students' societies and projects operate. Each society offers engaging events and programs for the students at SZABIST. 























### **Bolly Bash - Costume & Movie Night**


