





A Brief Overview of the Activities of SZABIST Trust

SZABIST is a manifestation of Shaheed Mohtarma Benazir Bhutto's vision that Pakistan should grow into a self-reliant and technologically advanced country. This journey dates back to 1993 and encompasses academic endeavors that go beyond the urban existence of SZABIST. The following milestones have punctuated the journey.

Reflecting SZABIST Trust's focus on service to the society, it initiated a number of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) programs, such as, the Mass Miniature Radiology (MMR) program aimed at early detection of lung diseases amongst children. This program benefited nearly 22,167 children.

Another CSR initiative was the SZABIST Medical Technical Assistants (MTA) program for girls. This initiative entailed a 16-month training program in Pharmacy, Pathology/Laboratory, Radiology, and Computer Literacy.

The MTA program has graduated 3 batches and the model developed at SZABIST has been adopted by 24 hospitals in 17 districts of Pakistan. So far, SZABIST has issued 117 certificates to girls under this program.

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III. Library and Computing Resources

The admission campaign for Fall 2018 was initiated in May 2018, followed by a test and interview in June-July 2018. While, the admission campaign for Spring 2019 was initiated in November 2018, followed by a test and interview in January 2019.


SZABIST's Student Orientation Program was held on August 29-30, 2018. 

III. Library and Computing Resources

Computing and Library resources of SZABIST Larkana campus are well-maintained and updated with latest books on a regular basis. The campus offers 6 programs in two major disciplines; Management Science and Computer Science. Until now, 579 graduates have successfully completed their degrees and the campus has 1317 enrolled students.



F Research and Development

SZABIST believes in identifying and developing new intellectual avenues. Therefore, it facilitates research and development programs. The main objective is to provide resources for sustainability and success of research and development projects. Also, to promote a culture of research and development, the Institute has made considerable investments, developed state-of-the-art scientific and technological research laboratories, and hired highly qualified personnel.

I. SZABIST'S Center for Biosciences Research (SCBR)

i. Introduction

SZABIST's Center for Biosciences Research (SCBR) is a platform where researchers and academicians from various biological fields are provided with an opportunity to perform basic and applied research related to biology and allied fields. The center is multidisciplinary in terms of research interests and has a dedicated qualified team of young professionals.

ii. Aim and Purpose of the Research

The research and innovation activities of SCBR are aimed to:

- Promote methods and applications of biological sciences to enhance human wellbeing.
- Discover new avenues of biological sciences to respond to the key themes of current international agendas.
- Maintain excellence in interdisciplinary biological research by advocating independent and original work and training future academic leaders through education and research.
- Encourage cross-disciplinary research initiatives focused on the unique plant and microbial species.

iii. Infrastructure and Facilities

SCBR is fully equipped with the instruments needed to perform the prescribed research. It also has full access to high quality chemicals, reagents, and/or kits required to implement researches. The center is in the process of continuous improvement with respect to acquiring more equipment and chemicals related to added research interests such as enzyme isolation, metabolite fingerprinting, bioactivity profiling, and biomarkers identification. The center has developed 3 new state-of-the-art laboratories for starting research in the areas of stem cells, applied microbiology and immunology, and natural product chemistry.

iv. Research Output

The SCBR is currently working on the following projects and their findings will be shared in the next report.

- Plant tissue culture of Papaya plant.
- Antibiogram of clinical isolates of Pseudomonas sp.
- Inducing drug resistance in probiotics.
- Antibiofilm activity of natural plant extract.

v. Future Plans

SCBR will start using animal models (rabbits and rats) for various pharmacological studies and enhance the research profile in the area of medical biochemistry. The team is also planning to expand its research related to multi-drug resistance in microbes.

II. Sustainable Development Research Center (SDRC)

i. Introduction

The Sustainable Development Research Center (SDRC) was established on January 5th, 2010. In the wake of global commitments on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), it was revamped in September 2017 with a view to align it with contemporary agenda of SDGs. Since then, it has been actively engaged in research and organizing research seminars and lecture sessions on relevant topics.

ii. Aim and Purpose of the Research

The major objectives of SDRC are dedicated to:

- Expanding knowledge on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through publishing research and conducting seminars at different platforms.
- Providing research based policy analysis on different areas of SDGs, specifically on poverty, family planning, nutrition and gender equality.
- Providing support in development of linkages with other partners i.e. public sector, private sector and international development partners, in terms of exploring options for future consultancy work for SDRC.

iii. Trainings/Conference/Seminars

(a) Trainings

SDRC has organized number of events during 2018-2019. Details of these are mentioned below:

 A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between SZABIST and Research and Training Wing, Planning and Development Department (P and DD), Government of

- Sindh, Karachi was signed on February 21, 2019. Accordingly, SZABIST has undertaken to conduct a series of trainings for the Government of Sindh officials. The trainings were conducted in collaboration between SDRC and Faculty of Management Sciences (FMS).
- The first 3-day training session on "Result Based Monitoring and Evaluation Management" was conducted at Karachi campus on March 25th –27th, 2019 for 11 P and DD officers (Grades 17 and 18) along with 2 administrative officials of SZABIST. The focus of training was tracking and evaluation of organizational performance because government officials are increasingly challenged to provide evidence for whether their projects or policies are achieving clearly defined outcomes and impacts. The training was conducted by Mr. Jahanzeb Asim, Ms. Farhat Fatima and Dr. Kaiser Bengali.
- The second 4-day training session on "Survey Data Analysis" was conducted at Karachi campus on April 9th -12th, 2019 for 12 Statistical Officers (Grade 17) of the Sindh Bureau of Statistics. The focus of training was to give knowledge of basic concepts of statistics and the ability to analyze quantitative survey data using special statistical software SPSS. The training was conducted by Dr. Salman Ahmed Shaikh and Ms. Mehak Younus.
- The third 4-day training session on "Survey Data Analysis" was conducted on April 16th–19th, 2019 at Larkana Campus for 10 Statistical Officers (Grade 17) of the Sindh Bureau of Statistics. The training was conducted by Dr. Salman Ahmed Shaikh and Ms. Mehak Younus.

iv. Future Plans

SDRC team is planning to arrange various seminars, guest speaker sessions, workshops and conferences to significantly aid and motivate general public contributions towards social welfare and development.

Plans to restructure SDRC are also in progress.

III. Institutional Research/Quality Enhancement Cell (IR/QEC)

i. Introduction

The Institutional Research/Quality Enhancement Cell (IR/QEC) was established in 2010 at SZABIST, under the directives of Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) of Higher Education Commission (HEC) Pakistan. The department ensures that the Institute abides by its ideology of providing quality education and competitive advantage to the students. In order to sustain and nurture the high academic standards, various reviews, analysis, and assessments were prepared and conducted by IR/QEC in 2018-19. This achievement is the result of vigorous and persistent efforts of the QEC staff at SZABIST.

As per the quantitative assessment conducted by QAA-HEC annually, IR/QEC's score has inclined from 89.19% in 2017-2018 to 93.59% in 2018-2019. This further endorses the Institute's dedicated approach in delivering quality education.

ii. Quality Assurance Measures Taken at SZABIST

The IR/QEC department works systematically on the assignments divided into: Academic Operations, Policies, and Outreach.

1. Academic Operations

In order to inspect and enhance the quality of academic operations, the department undertook the following assignments:

a. Strengthening the Institutional Research-Self Assessment Report (SAR)

The IR/QEC organizes and manages the Self-Assessment process of all academic programs being offered at all campuses of SZABIST. The process results in generating Self-Assessment Report (SAR) of a program. The SAR is a combination of Program Team (PT) Report, Review by IR/QEC, and Assessment Team (AT) Report. It assesses the level of accomplishment of instructive targets (i.e. objective) and results (i.e. outcome) by the programs, give input to quality affirmation of the system, enhance scholastic benchmarks, and upgrade students' learning procedure.

- The SAR Process (1st/2nd/3rd cycle) of Karachi campus was initiated for 26 programs namely; BS BIO, MS BIO, BS SS, MSSS, PhD SS, BSCS, MSCS, PhD CS, MA EDU, MS ELM, PhD ELM, MoA, BMS, MS Media Studies, BBA, BABS, BS Accounting and Finance, BS Entrepreneurship, MBA 36, MBA 72, MBA Banking and Finance, EMBA, MPM, MSPM, MSMS and PhD MS.
- In 2018-2019, IR/QEC initiated SAR Process (2nd SAR Cycle) of 4 programs offered at Larkana Campus i.e. BSCS, BBA, MBA 36, MBA 90. The PT reports were reviewed and feedback was provided for revision.
- Further, for Islamabad campus, the SAR PT report process has been completed for all programs and AT process has been initiated. During 2018-2019, the IR/QEC department reviewed the PT and AT reports of MSCS and MSSS programs.

2. Policies

The IR/QEC implemented the following quality assurance measures to further reinforce SZABIST's policy framework.

a. Surveys

To improve the quality of education being imparted at SZABIST, the IR/QEC elicits feedback from various collaborators (teacher and course evaluation, graduating students, alumni, full-time faculty, and employers) through surveys. The solicited responses were meticulously analyzed to assist Senior Management in overcoming policy and procedural limitations to augment smooth operations of SZABIST's academic and administrative departments. The following surveys had been conducted in the academic year: Staff, Full-time Faculty, Alumni, Graduating Students' and Employers'.

i. Graduating Student Survey

In order to understand the needs of our graduates, SZABIST conducts Graduating Student Survey (GSS) on annual basis. The IR/QEC engages in analysis of GSS which helps SZABIST Management to identify and rectify shortcomings and add value in the programs being offered. The survey solicits graduates' feedback on the effectiveness of various aspects of their respective programs and several factors contributing towards students' overall educational experience.

This year department-wise graphical reports of GSS 2018 were prepared by IR/QEC. As a step towards digitalizing surveys, 32 Graduating Students Survey Forms were reviewed, revised and uploaded on ZABDESK with the collaboration of ZABSolutions for final semester graduating students.

ii. Alumni Survey

As per regular practice, the Alumni Survey is conducted annually by the Executive Development Centre (EDC) and data is shared with IR/QEC for analysis. The Alumni Survey focuses on issues related to students' professional careers upon completing their degrees. In particular, this survey aims at determining whether SZABIST has been successful in producing quality graduates who have been successful in getting jobs matching their field of study. In addition, it aims to mobilize alumni to strengthen their bond with the Institute, and stimulate a sense of responsibility of promoting the alma-mater in their respective organization. Moreover, the survey results help the institute strengthen and expand its professional network, gain insights on changing market trends, and assist the Management in formulating strategies accordingly.

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IR/QEC completed graphical report of Alumni Survey 2018 this year. Further, a discussion is underway with EDC for the revision of Alumni Survey form 2019.

iii. Full-time Faculty Survey

The IR/QEC initiated the Faculty Survey in 2010 to determine the full-time faculty's satisfaction level at SZABIST. Further, the main purpose of conducting the survey is to cater the needs of faculty and provide them a conducive working environment for augmenting research productivity. Also, at SZABIST, the top management greatly values the opinion of its faculty members for enhancing their effectiveness and professionalism. The results of the survey are also incorporated in the respective program's Self-Assessment Report.

Over the course of year 2018-2019, the form for Full-time Faculty Survey was reviewed and revised by PhD Faculty of SZABIST with the approval of Vice-President Academics, Dr. M. Altaf Mukati. IR/QEC staff conducted meetings with HoD Management Sciences and other senior faculty to refine the survey tool for productive feedback. A consolidated draft report of the Faculty Survey 2018-2019 was prepared and submitted to the Senior Management for further action.

iv. Employers Survey

As per regular practice, the Employer Survey is conducted by the Executive Development Centre (EDC) and data is shared with IR/QEC for analyzing it. The employers' feedback enables SZABIST to identify factors such as graduate market worth, graduate employability, employers' expectations and preferences, and employers' satisfaction level. In addition, the survey results assists EDC to identify available opportunities in the job market, developing plans and devising strategies to subsequently increase placement and internship prospects for the graduates.

In 2018-2019, the EDC department proposed amendments in the Employer Survey form. The form will be soon shared with senior faculty and PhD scholars for review.

v. Staff Survey

In higher education institutes, staff is considered as the operational backbone because they ensure timely coordination between all stakeholders such as regulatory bodies, senior management, faculty, staff, and current and prospective students. The IR/QEC conducts Staff Survey during Fall Semester. The main purpose of this survey is to gauge employee satisfaction level with policies and procedures being practiced by SZABIST to improve staff efficiency level and effectiveness.

Staff survey was initiated with a revised questionnaire during 2018-2019. As per research guidelines, the survey tool was shared with senior faculty and PhD scholars for review and correction. Upon approval of Vice-President Academics, the survey was conducted and a consolidated Staff Survey report was prepared from the collected responses.

b. Internal Academic Audit

The IR/QEC department has been established to bring standardization to all academic and non-academic activities. Hence, the department regularly explores ways to further strengthen the quality of education being imparted to students. Following the department's philosophy, IR/QEC initiated a new project called Internal Academic Audit in January 2018. The project was undertaken with the aim of identifying discrepancies in the marks awarded to the students.

Karachi Campus

The IR/QEC department conducted the audit for Summer 2018. Exam copies of Karachi campus were assessed on the basis of the grading scheme implemented at SZABIST and evaluators' checking style. The report was shared with Registrar and VP Academics for further action.

Other Campuses

Furthermore, audits were initiated for summer courses in Islamabad, Larkana, Hyderabad and Dubai campus and Phase 1 and 2 were completed.

KHDA

In 2018-2019, IR/QEC conducted the exam audit for SZABIST Dubai Campus. The report was also submitted to KHDA in January 2019.

3. Outreach

a. Relations with HEC and other Regulatory Bodies

The IR/QEC maintains close working relations with HEC and other regulatory bodies, along with undertaking assignments to enhance SZABIST's education standard. This includes: fulfillment of information provision requests, and compilation and submission of documentation. The department regularly submits information required by HEC-QAA, Chartered Inspection and Evaluation Committee (CIEC), and Knowledge and Human Development Authority (KHDA), UAE. Moreover, to acquaint staff members with latest quality assurance practices, civic and social responsibilities followed around the world, the department maintains membership with Asia Pacific Quality Assurance Network (APQN), Association of Quality Assurance Agency of Islamic World (AQAAIW) and Talloires Network.

The workshop was arranged in connection with HEC's aim of improving quality of the education being imparted through MS/M.PHIL and Ph.D. Programs.

QEC Activities at other Campuses

SZABIST has QEC offices set up in all campuses which ensure standardization in the academic and administrative services across all SZABIST campuses. The establishment of QEC offices assists in improving the quality of the academic programs by identifying and monitoring the difference between SZABIST curriculum and respective market require-

ments to propose initiatives in order to reduce the gap and strengthen the current offerings. Thus, QEC personnel across all campuses are engaged in the execution and completion of Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of their respective programs, conducting various surveys and facilitating visits of HEC and other regulatory bodies in their campuses.

1. Islamabad Campus

The QEC department at Islamabad campus was established in September 2012. However, due to certain pitfalls, the department's operations were suspended. The department became functional in January 2015. Since then it has been working effectively to maintain quality standards at Islamabad Campus.

During 2018-2019, QEC Islamabad has launched the second phase of Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) in which SARs of all programs were initiated through multiple meetings with Program Teams. Further, Program Teams submitted the PT reports that have been reviewed by QEC department as per SAR process. These SARs have completed the Assessment Team phase and are now in the completion process.







QEC Islamabad attended a one-day seminar on "Quality Assurance at Higher Education and University Ranking" organized by Foundation University Rawalpindi Campus. The guest speaker was Dr. Riaz Ahmed, Director QA, NUST. The purpose of the seminar was to promote the quality culture in Higher Education Institutes by implementing the guidelines provided by Higher Education Commission and role of QEC in HEI's. 20 participants from different universities located in major cities of Pakistan attended this seminar.

2. Larkana Campus

Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) at Larkana campus started its operations in January 2015 and since then it is responsible for assessing, improving the quality of academic and administrative operations at the campus. QEC Larkana has been working and updating the Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of BBA, BSCS and MBA programs.

4. Dubai Campus

The Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) at SZABIST Dubai was launched under the direction and guidance of the QEC at the Home Campus. The QEC Dubai was launched in 2014 under Professor Dr. Hummayoun Naeem who is currently the Head of Campus. The QEC at SZABIST Dubai works in collaboration with QEC at the Home Campus and is constantly involved in supporting its basic function i.e. to foster Institutional Effectiveness (IE) to support research, planning, policy formation, streamlining processes, decision making and critical academic initiatives of strategic importance for SZABIST.

Activities of QEC Dubai during 2018-2019 are as follows:

 As part of its Community Development program, SZABIST organized a 2-day Free of Cost workshop on "Data Analysis, Reporting and Presentation using MS Excel 2016" for alumni and industry professionals on January 1st, 2019.



• SZABIST Dubai Campus in partnership with #PakistanisinDubai organized a successful seminar on Impression Management on July 20th, 2019. The seminar was conducted by Mr. Zubair Azam.

Future Plans

In 2019-2020, IR/QEC will be concentrating on the AT Process of initiated SARs of various programs offered by SZABIST, providing support to accreditation and regulatory bodies including HEC, NBEAC, PEC, NCEAC and others, conducting and analyzing surveys, Trend analysis of different surveys, engaging in various admission or program analyses, preparing and strengthening SZABIST publications and reports. The department also plans to participate and conduct QA workshops nationally and internationally and to produce research papers. Revamping of the Survey portal is also intended. MS programs review, PhD programs review, and Institutional Performance Evaluation visits by HEC are also expected in coming year.

IV. Board of Advanced Studies and Research (BASR)

SZABIST leadership encourages and nurtures a research-oriented culture at the Institute. Board of Advanced Studies and Research (BASR) committee was established in 2015 with the approval of Board of Trustees. The committee comprises of eminent academicians and researchers developing, reviewing and revising the policies, procedures and structure of programs and research activities at postgraduate level for the advancement of research and development. The decisions taken by Doctoral Committee (DC) and Research Committee (RC) are brought to BASR for deliberation and ratification.

i. Doctoral Committee (DC)

Doctoral Committee (DC) was formed in April, 2016. The DC functions under BASR in campuses where MS and/or PhD programs in any discipline are offered. The purpose of this committee is to ease numerous functions and accelerate the decision making process in every campus. It will send recommendations which are subsequently be approved by the BASR.

DC monitors and evaluates the semester-wise progress of individual students of MS and PhD programs. It handles students' issues such as satisfactory and unsatisfactory performance, semester freezing, provision of approved supervisors and co-supervisors to them, getting their theses and dissertations evaluated and examined by internal and external evaluators domestically or academically advanced countries, time bar extensions, cancellation of admission (mainly due to time bar issues), releasing notifications for award of degrees, appointing Advisory Committee and so on. DC has a huge pool of approved foreign evaluators which keeps on updating as per requirements from different countries such as United Kingdom, Germany, Turkey, Malaysia, China and America for student foreign evaluation. In addition, DC focuses on the emerging HEC policies and guidelines for compliance and accreditation of various MS and PhD programs.







Institutional Ethics Review Board (IERB)

As a part of the Doctoral Committee (DC), The Institutional Ethical Review Board (IERB) is an administrative body established to protect the rights and welfare of human research subjects recruited to participate in research activities conducted under the auspices of the SZABIST.

The IERB is charged with the responsibility of reviewing, prior to its initiation, all research involving human participants. The IERB is concerned with protecting the welfare, rights, and privacy of human and other living thing subjects. The IERB has the authority to approve, disapprove, monitor and require modifications in all research activities that fall within its jurisdiction as specified by both the federal regulations and SZABIST policy. The IERB is composed of Legal Advisor, Ethical Professional and other members in order to provide complete and adequate review of human research and its institutional, legal, scientific, and social implications. The Board also include at least one member who is not a specialized in that aspect.

ii. Research Committee (RC)

Research Committee nourishes the research eco-system across campuses. It devises policies to incentivize research

publications (in papers, books, conference papers, etc.). Recently, it has established a Plagiarism Committee across campuses to tackle the complex matters of research ethics. It has also reset the honoraria for publications and participation in national and international conferences. In addition, various endeavors are undertaken at departmental level for establishment of research centers and committees, and special interest groups (SIGs), attainment of research grants and preparation of formal document of research policy.

V. Office of Research, Innovation, and Commercialization (ORIC)

i. Introduction

The ORIC office at SZABIST has been initiated by VP(Academics) in March, 2018 to provide end to end services for all matters about research and development, innovation, Inventions, commercialization, patents, collaborations, arranging seminars/ colloquia/ symposium/ conferences/ workshops, etc. and research publication honorarium. ORIC is helping its researchers to do high-quality research that will shape futures, solve real-life problems, change policies, and influence practice, all to the benefit of the people of Pakistan. ORIC wants our researchers to represent the many different viewpoints and voices of our dynamic, diverse society to ensure inclusivity and a better future for all. We want our research efforts to be sustainable so that our research community is constantly being replenished with new perspectives and skills, underpinned by an unswerving commitment to sound research ethics.

ORIC welcomes opportunities to collaborate with like-minded researchers, research managers, and administrators, and our doors are open to postgraduate students seeking a research home where quality counts. The ORIC is trying to establish a good working relationship with other higher learning institutions, industries, and donor agencies especially HEC, PSF, and other universities in Pakistan in the activities that can enhance entrepreneurship, academic, and research excellence.

ii. Mission and Objectives

The mission and objectives of ORIC comprise:

- Raise fund for research
- Provide information to faculty about various available research grants
- Link faculty and students with relevant industry
- Help and guide on patent filing and licensing
- Interface between faculty and the commercial sector
- Work with patent counsel to assess patentability/licensing
- Evaluate markets for commercialization of inventions
- Identify potential licensees

- Assist with negotiating problematic sponsored research agreements
- Help faculty start companies

iii. Aim and Purpose of the Research

The research and innovation activities of ORIC are aimed:

- To drive high impact innovation, applied research and entrepreneurship
- To transform Pakistan from the platform of SZABIST into a knowledge-based economy dependent upon innovation and entrepreneurship
- To link research and commercialization of SZABIST with emerging and existing firms across Pakistan and around the world
- To encourage work closely with the researchers and on-campus Incubators and S and T Park

iv. Facilities

ORIC provides the following facilities:

a. Commercialization

ORIC intends to facilitate the faculty, students and staff in commercializing their products through:

b. Plagiarism

ORIC provides critical support to the faculty through advice on plagiarism matters. Director ORIC chairs the Plagiarism Standing Committee. The committee is in process of finalizing a new draft on Plagiarism Policy for SZABIST. The aim of this policy is to apprise students, teachers, researchers and staff about plagiarism and how it can be avoided. It is also aimed at discouraging plagiarism by regulating and authorizing punitive actions against those found guilty of the act of plagiarism.

c. Copyrights for ZABSOL Products

The ZABDESK and ZAB CMS are in-house designed software for students, staff and faculty. The copyright applications were submitted in September 2018 and approved on August 8th, 2019 from copyright IPO Office.



v. Research Output/Achievement

a. Peridot Research Program

PERIDOT is the Franco-Pakistani Hubert Curien Partnership (PHC) Program providing opportunities to Pakistani and French researchers to interact through joint research activities. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Development (MAEDI) and the Ministry of Higher Education and Research (MESRI) implement the program in Pakistan by the Higher Education Commission (HEC) and in France, jointly. The objective of this program is to develop new scientific and technological cooperation between French and Pakistani higher education institutions/research laboratories by supporting the mobility of researchers from both sides.

ORIC conducts orientation sessions and briefing talks to share information on the call for proposals formally with SZABIST faculty.

b. National Research Programme for Universities (NRPU)

NRPU is a flagship Research Programme of HEC for funding research grants on competitive merit for high-level and promising scientific research projects that demonstrate strategic relevance and impact to local industry and society. To provide financial support for basic and applied research for researchers across Pakistan, NRPU has been serving the nation for more than a decade to provide a platform for academicians to win grants for basic and applied research.

The main focus of this program is to competitively select research projects that will address national priorities through supporting basic and applied research as well as translational research/experimental and transformative research to push research to do country-specific, problem based having an impact on society. HEC intends to stimulate partnerships between academic researchers and end-users.

ORIC organizes highly focused sessions and table talks across SZABIST to spread awareness to the faculty members for all disciplines.



c. Ignite - National Technology Fund

SZABIST final year projects won Ignite funding, Ignite funds startups and innovative projects that utilize fourth industrial wave tech to solve local problems and target global opportunities in health, education, energy, agriculture, telecom, finance, and other verticals. Ignite, the national network of incubators across Pakistan nurtures startups and engages them with investors and corporations. Ignite has launched a program to prepare one million people for the future of work.

SZABIST participated in National Grassroots ICT Research Initiative (NGIRI) 2019. Among many FYP(Final Year Projects), total eleven (11) projects have been a win for funding from different campuses of SZABIST, i.e. Islamabad, Hyderabad, and Karachi.

d. Technology Development Fund (TDF)

ORIC SZABIST encourage faculty to apply for grants and Funds programs. The Technology Development Fund (TDF) was awarded to Dr. Wajid Zulqarnain, Department of Media Sciences, SZABIST, Islamabad for the project titled "Showcasing R and D efforts in Pakistan with special reference to positive image building of the Higher Education Institutions" by HEC in May 2019. The project was awarded a funding of PKR 14 Million for two years. During the last one-year, Dr. Wajid and his team has made a number of documentaries, which will be online soon. Media personnel and other imminent personalities have reviewed the documentaries and they have highly appreciated the work.

E. The National Center in Big Data and Cloud Computing (NCBC)

Smart Manufacturing Lab: The Smart Manufacturing Lab at SZABIST is a part of the initiative taken by the Higher Education Commission (HEC), Pakistan under the program titled "Establishment of National Center for Big data and Cloud Computing (NCBC)". To address these challenges, Smart Manufacturing Lab focuses on the implementation of Industry 4.0 concepts in local industries and act as a platform that enables close collaboration between students, researchers, and practitioners

Predictive Analytics Lab: Predictive Analytics Lab (Islamabad) was established under the National Center for Big Data and Cloud Computing, sponsored by the Higher Education Commission of amount Rs. 81.24 Million. The main objectives of NCBC are to carry out research in big data and cloud computing, solve local problems using technology, and provide services to academia and industrial partners. The project duration is 3 years extendable to 5 years.

Financial Assistance

As part of its social responsibility, SZABIST has developed a robust financial assistance program which is bifurcated into Merit and Need based scholarships.

Scholarships cover full or partial tuition fee, however, in some cases scholarships also cover books, boarding, transportation, monthly stipend and admission fee. A fair and transparent process is adopted to select the students for these scholarships. The process entails short listing of candidates on the basis of objective criteria, followed by a panel interview to assess the candidates' financial eligibility. In case of scholarships funded by external donor agencies, the selection process also includes physical verification of student's information prior to award of the scholarship.

Financial Assistance Provided by SZABIST

Scholarships are funded by means of the institute's funds, these include;

- SZABIST Need-Based Scholarship
 - **◆** Criteria
 - Annual family income should be lower than PKR 900,000.
 - Student should have a minimum GPA of 2.5.
- SZABIST Merit-Based Scholarship
 - **◆** Criteria
 - Student should have a minimum GPA of 3.7 to be eligible.
 - Scholarship is awarded to the student with highest GPA in section.







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Figure 2.4: SZABIST Karachi Campus-Program-wise Internship Placement 2018 - 2019




Figure 2.5: SZABIST Karachi Campus-Sector-wise Internship Job Placement 2018 - 2019




