





A Brief Overview of the Activities of SZABIST Trust

SZABIST is a manifestation of Shaheed Mohtarma Benazir Bhutto's vision that Pakistan should grow into a self-reliant and technologically advanced country. This journey dates back to 1993 and encompasses academic endeavors that go beyond the urban existence of SZABIST. The following milestones have punctuated the journey.

Reflecting SZABIST Trust's focus on service to the society, it initiated a number of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) programs, such as, the Mass Miniature Radiology (MMR) program aimed at early detection of lung diseases amongst children. This program benefited nearly 22,167 children.

Another CSR initiative was the SZABIST Medical Technical Assistants (MTA) program for girls. This initiative entailed a 16-month BSMS program was launched at Karachi Islamabad Campus. SZABIST Larkana Campus training program in Pharmacy, Pathology Radiology, /Laboratory, and Literacy.

The MTA program has graduated 3 batches and the model developed at SZABIST has been adopted by 24 hospitals in 17 districts of Islamabad Campus. Pakistan. Śo far, SZABIST has issued 117 certificates to girls under this program.

ITVE were established in Gharo-Thatta and Sehwan Jamshoro.





III. Library and Computing Resources

The library and computer resources at Karachi Campus are well maintained and frequently updated. The library contains approximately 14,500 books, and the computer labs are equipped with 312 desktop computers.

IV. Admissions, Orientation and Convocation 2017-2018

SZABIST Karachi campus conducts its admissions annually during June-July. However, biannual admissions were carried out for 4 programs this year. The admission process includes a computerized test, interview and orientation for successful candidates. The admission campaign for Fall was initiated in May 2017, followed by a test and interview in July 2017. While, the admission campaign for spring was initiated in November 2017, followed by a test and interview on January 2018.









For Orientation 2017, multiple sessions were organized from August 29-30, 2017 at the Campus. The academic year was initiated on September 5, 2017. For the second orientation, a session was organized on February 6, 2018. The campus successfully enrolled a total of 1,903 students. SZABIST management, faculty and staff welcomed the entrants for embarking their new academic journey in the offered disciplines. The relevant Head of Departments and Program Managers introduced new students to their respective programs. Also, a proper tour was arranged for the newly inducted students to familiarize them will all the campus buildings.















The 14th Convocation was held on December 9, 2017 at PAF Convention Centre Karachi. The Chief Guest of the occasion was Mr. Murad Ali Shah, Chief Minister Sindh. More than 3,000 guests attended the event. At the ceremony, 1,026 degrees were conferred to graduates. Also, 12 Gold Medals and 11 Silver Medals were awarded to the graduates having outclassed academic performance in their respective domain.



IV. Admissions, Orientation and Convocation 2017-2018

The admissions at SZABIST Islamabad campus take place biannually in June-July for Fall semester and January-February for Spring semester. Annual Report

III. Library and Computing Recourses



F Research and Development

SZABIST believes in identifying and developing new intellectual avenues. Therefore, it facilitates research and development programs. The main objective is to provide resources for sustainability and success of research and development projects. Also, to promote a culture of research and development, the Institute has made considerable investments, developed state-of-the-art scientific and technological research laboratories, and hired highly qualified personnel.

I. SZABIST'S Center for Biosciences Research (SCBR)

i. Introduction

SZABIST's Center for Biosciences Research (SCBR) is a platform where researchers and academicians from various biological fields are provided with an opportunity to perform basic and applied research related to biology and allied fields. The center is multidisciplinary in terms of research interests and has a dedicated qualified team of young professionals.

ii. Aim and Purpose of the Research

The research and innovation activities of SCBR are aimed to:

- Promote methods and applications of biological sciences to enhance human wellbeing.
- Discover new avenues of biological sciences to respond to the key themes of current international agendas.
- Maintain excellence in interdisciplinary biological research by advocating independent and original work and training future academic leaders through education and research.
- Encourage cross-disciplinary research initiatives focused on the unique plant and microbial species.

iii. Infrastructure and Facilities


SCBR is fully equipped with the instruments needed to perform the prescribed research. It also has full access to high quality chemicals, reagents, and/or kits required to implement researches. The center is in the process of continuous improvement with respect to acquiring more equipment and chemicals related to added research interests such as enzyme isolation, metabolite fingerprinting, bioactivity profiling, and biomarkers identification. The center has developed 3 new state-of-the-art laboratories for starting research in the areas of stem cells, applied microbiology and immunology, and natural product chemistry.

iv. Research Output


a. Existing Projects

1. Antibiograms related to Mobile Phones

A number of microorganisms which are potentially harmful to users are present on the mobile phones. This experimental study identified pathogenic bacteria on cell phones by biochemical characterization using biochemical kits including RapID ANA II and RapID SS/u and disc diffusion method. Out of 100 samples of cell phones monitored, 97 were found to be contaminated with bacteria. E.coli, Staphyloccusaureus, Staphylococcus intermedius, Bacillus subtilis were the most commonly found isolates. Species of yeast were also associated with some samples: Candida albicans and Candidaglabarata. Antibiotic susceptibility testing was performed after the identification of bacterial isolates and resistant and susceptible microorganisms were identified.



Microorganism susceptible





Resistant to various antibiotics

2. Effect of Efflux Pump Blockers on the Efficacy of Antibiotics against MRSA

The objective of the study was to study the effect of efflux pump blockers when used in combination with different types of antibiotics. The efflux pump inhibitors used were Tamoxifen and Verapamil. The antibiotics included in the study were Amphotericin B, Chloramphenicol and Nalidixic

Acid. They were used against five strains of Methicillin Resistant Staphylococcus aureus. The methods used for assessing the microbial inhibition and growth were Minimum Inhibitory Concentration (MIC) Test and Minimum Bactericidal Concentration (MBC) Test. It was found that when the antibiotics and efflux pump blockers were tested solely against the bacterial strains, high resistivity was observed. When the antibiotics were used in combination with the efflux pump blockers, the results were surprisingly very effective. The growth of bacteria was significantly inhibited, and efficacy of antibiotics was increased by blocking their removal from the cells by blocking the efflux pumps. The combination of Tamoxifen as efflux pump blocker and Amphotericin B as antibiotic gave better results against the bacterial strains when used in combination as compared to other drugs used in combination and solely. Thus, research should be more focused to study about the efflux pump blockers as they can serve as useful agents in treatment of pathogenic diseases.







3. Antimicrobial effects of Fruits And Vegetables on Food Borne Organisms and Probiotics

The objective of the study is to check the effect of fruits and vegetables with and without peel on the probiotics and foodborne organisms. Different samples were taken in order to isolate foodborne organism and probiotics. After the appearances of colonies on media and biochemical test of the bacteria, gram staining and catalase test were performed for the probiotics and foodborne organism. The effect of common antibiotics on the food-borne organism and probiotics were tested on the Muller Hilton agar. The antibiotics used were ampicillin, penicillin and streptomycin. The effect of fruits and vegetables with and without peel on the food borne organism and probiotics were shown using three different methods: MIC, MBC and well diffusion method. During the method of the probiotics, Lactobacillus acidophilus showed resistance against all the antibiotics whereas, in food borne organism, Streptococcus agalactiae showed resistance against all the antibiotics. The well diffusion method with peeled and without peeled tomato showed the highest activity against the entire food-borne organism and there was no effect on the probiotics between the complete 5 days experiment. After observation, it was noticed that tomato with peel inhibits E.coli with the concentration of 2.5 µg/ml and without peel shows S. aureus with the concentration of 1.25µg/ml and MBC results were 5µg/ml against the E. coli. In the case of apple, MIC with the concentration of 2.5µg/ml against S. aurgerus and without peel on E. coli with the concentration of 2.5µg/ml. and MBC results were 5µg/ml against S. aureus.

b. Future Projects

The SCBR has initiated several new projects:

- Effects of Brazilian Nuts on High Cholesterol Levels in Blood.
- Isolation and Characterization of New Strains of Probiotics for Industrial Use.
- Metabolic Characterization of MRSA and MSSA.

v. Future Plans

SCBR will start using animal models (rabbits and rats) for various pharmacological studies and enhance the research profile in the area of medical biochemistry. The team is also planning to expand its research related to multi-drug resistance in microbes. In collaboration with Aga Khan University and DOW University of Health Sciences, various projects related to different genes involved in cancer and diabetes are also in the designing phase.

II. Sustainable Development Research Center (SDRC)

i. Introduction

The Sustainable Development Research Center (SDRC) was established on January 5, 2010. In the wake of global commitments on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), it was revamped in September 2017 with a view to align it with contemporary agenda of SDGs. Since then, it has been actively engaged in research and organizing research seminars and lecture sessions on relevant topics.

ii. Aim and Purpose of the Research

The major objectives of SDRC are dedicated to:

- Expanding knowledge on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through publishing research and conducting seminars at different platforms.
- Providing research based policy analysis on different areas of SDGs, specifically on poverty, family planning, nutrition, and gender equality.
- Providing support in development of linkages with other partners, i.e., public sector, private sector and international development partners, in terms of exploring options for future consultancy work for SDRC.

iii. Research Output

 SDRC published a report titled State of the Economy: 1990-2015 Economy on a Roller Coaster – And Stuck in the Mud! prepared by Dr. Kaiser Bengali, Dean of Management Sciences and Head of SDRC. Further, a seminar was organized on the stated subject on October 6, 2018 which was addressed by Dr. Farrukh Iqbal, Director IBA Karachi and Mr. Shabbar Zaidi, renowned financial expert. Dr. Bengali presented an alarming and disturbing situation with regards to multiple indicator related to the basic sectors of the economy: crop agriculture, large-scale manufacturing, and external trade report low growth and high level of volatility – which portrayed long-term stagnation.

The SDRC team is engaged in a research study, Performance of the Pakistan Economy for the period 1965

 1985 to fill a critical research gap in existing literature.
 The purpose of this research is to objectively assess the economic performance of this period, which is characterized by tumultuous change. The initial phase of literature review has been completed, along with basic data collection and analysis is in process.



SDRC has organized a lecture session and a number of seminars during 2017-2018. Details of these seminars are mentioned below:

- SDRC, in collaboration with Faculty of Education and Social Sciences, organized two-day workshop on November 6-7, 2017, on ToT for Youth Leaders. Mr. Riaz Nawab, District Manager, Faces Pakistan and Dr. Riaz Ahmed Shaikh, Dean of Social Science and Education Department initiated the 1st and 2nd formal session and 3rd session was chaired by Allama Mohammad Ahsan Siddique, Ambassador/Secretary General/Founding Chief Executive Interfaith Commission for Peace and Harmony, Pakistan.
- SDRC, in collaboration with Faculty of Education and Social Science, organized a session on November 29, 2017, on Serving Humanity: Remembering Legends of Pakistan to pay tribute to our two legends, Abdul Sattar Edhi and Perveen Rahman. Dr. Riaz Ahmed Shaikh, Dean of Social Science and Education Department, opened the sessions with a formal note. Mr. Faisal Edhi, son of Abdul Sattar Edhi and Head of Edhi Foundation, and Ms. Aquila Ismail, younger sister of Ms. Perveen Rahman were the Chief Guests of the event.
- SDRC organized a lecture session on Democratic Transition in Pakistan on February 22, 2018. The session was addressed by Dr. Kaiser Bengali, Head SDRC/Dean of Management Sciences, and Dr. Riaz Shaikh, Dean of Social Sciences and Education Department.









- Goal 5 of SDGs demands various initiatives in the near future to ensure gender equality. On March 12, 2018, SDRC organized a seminar related to International Women's Day titled Everyday Issues that Dis-empower Women. Pathfinder International, in partnership with
- SZABIST SDRC, organized a Seminar on Family Planning and Population – Commemorating the World Contraception Day on October 10, 2018. Dr. Tabinda Sarosh, Country Director Pathfinder International, opened the session formally and highlighted the importance of family planning and population control.

iv. Future Plans

SDRC team is also planning to arrange various seminars, guest speaker sessions and conferences to significantly aid and motivate general public contributions toward social welfare and development.

III. Institutional Research/Quality Enhancement Cell (IR/QEC)

i. Introduction

The Institutional Research/Quality Enhancement Cell (IR/QEC) was established in 2010 at SZABIST, under the directives of Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) of Higher Education Commission (HEC) Pakistan. The department ensures that the Institute abides by its ideology of providing quality education and competitive advantage to the students. In order to sustain and nurture the high academic standards, various reviews, analyses, and assessments were prepared and conducted by IR/QEC in 2017-18. The achievement performance is the result of vigorous and persistent efforts of the QEC staff at SZABIST.

In 2015-2016, IR/QEC received its highest rating "93.90%" in the last quantitative assessment conducted by QAA-HEC. Furthermore, the QAA-HEC ratings for QEC SZABIST for the recent year is yet to be received. However, an extensive revision was done in March 2018 whereby a customized portal was developed for QAA-HEC with the assistance of ZabSolutions.



ii. Quality Assurance Measures Taken at SZABIST

The IR/QEC department works systematically on the assignments divided into: Academic Operations, Policies, and Outreach.

1. Academic Operations

In order to inspect and enhance the quality of academic operations, the department undertook the following assignments:

a. Strengthening the Institutional Research-Self Assessment Report (SAR)

The IR/QEC organizes and manages the Self-Assessment process of all academic programs being offered at all campuses of SZABIST. The process results in generating Self-Assessment Report (SAR) of a program. The SAR is a combination of Program Team (PT) Report, Review by IR/QEC, and Assessment Team (AT) Report. It assesses the level of accomplishment of instructive targets (i.e. objective) and results (i.e. outcome) by the programs, give input to quality affirmation of the system, enhance scholastic benchmarks, and upgrade students' learning procedure.

In 2017-2018, the IR/QEC worked on the following 6 PT Reports of Islamabad and Hyderabad campuses. The PT report process has been completed for all programs and AT process of Islamabad has been initiated.

To further improve the quality of education being imparted at SZABIST, the IR/QEC elicits feedback from various collaborators (teacher and course evaluation, graduating students, alumni, full-time faculty, and employers) through surveys. The solicited responses were meticulously analyzed to assist Senior Management in overcoming policy and procedural limitations to augment smooth operations of SZABIST's academic and administrative departments. The following surveys had been conducted in the academic year: Staff, Full-time Faculty, Alumni, Graduating Students' and Employers'.

i. Graduating Student Survey

In order to understand the needs of our graduates, SZABIST conducts Graduating Student Survey (GSS) on annual basis. The IR/QEC engages in analysis of GSS which helps SZABIST Management to identify and rectify shortcomings and add value in the programs being offered. The survey solicits graduates' feedback on the effectiveness of various aspects of their respective programs and several factors contributing towards students' overall educational experience.

ii. Alumni Survey

As per regular practice, the Alumni Survey is conducted annually by the Executive Development Centre (EDC) and data is shared with IR/QEC for analysis. The Alumni Survey focuses on issues related to students' professional careers upon completing their degrees. In particular, this survey aims at determining whether SZABIST has been successful in producing quality graduates who have been successful in getting jobs matching their field of study. In addition, it aims to mobilize alumni to strengthen their bond with the Institute, and stimulate a sense of responsibility of promoting the alma-mater in their respective organization. Moreover, the survey results help the institute strengthen and expand its professional network, gain insights on changing market trends, and assist the Management in formulating strategies accordingly.

iii. Full-time Faculty Survey

The IR/QEC initiated the Faculty Survey in 2010 to determine the full-time faculty's satisfaction level at SZABIST. Further, the main purpose of conducting the survey is to cater the needs of faculty and provide them a

iv. Employers Survey

As per regular practice, the Employer Survey is conducted by the Executive Development Centre (EDC) and data is shared with IR/QEC for analyzing it. The employers' feedback enables SZABIST to identify factors such as graduate market worth, graduate employability, employers' expectations and preferences, and employers' satisfaction level. In addition, the survey results assists EDC to identify available opportunities in the job market, developing plans and devising strategies to subsequently increase placement and internship prospects for the graduates.

v. Staff Survey

The IR/QEC conducts Staff Survey during Fall Semester. The main purpose of this survey is to gauge employee satisfaction level with policies and procedures being practiced by SZABIST to improve staff efficiency level and effectiveness. In higher education institutes, staff is considered as the operational backbone because they ensure timely coordination between all stakeholders such as regulatory bodies, senior management, faculty, staff, and current and prospective students.

b. Admission Data Analysis

The IR/QEC staff members assisted in formulating direction for future academic operations, ensuring competitiveness, and determining marketing strategy by conducting a detailed analysis of admission data for Karachi, Islamabad, Larkana and Hyderabad campus.

The key highlights of Karachi campus during admission 2017-18 showed that total applications increased by 11% however, the applied-to-admitted rate was 37%. The admissions trend shows students intake of 1,445 in 2015, increasing to 1,771 in 2016 and then increasing to 1,903 in 2017, i.e. by 7.5%.

The results showed increase in number of applicants in BBA, MBA B&F, MBA 36 credit hours, EMBA, MS Project Management, BSCS, PhD Computing, BS Media Sciences, MSMD, BS Social Sciences, MSSS, PhD SS, Master of Public Health (MPH), MS Bio Sciences and LLB program.

On the other hand, a decline was seen in MBA 72 credit hours, MPM, MSMS, PhD MS, MSCS, BE Mechatronic, Master of Advertising, MS Education Leadership and Management, PhD Education Leadership & Management, BS Biosciences and BABS.

c. Program Analysis

Program analysis is helpful in identifying any constraints within the offered degree for sustaining quality and continuous improvement programs which must be addressed for a further strengthening of the offered program. Additionally, this planning tool helps program teams to explore factors that positively affect the academic and administrative structure of the program. During the year, IR/QEC conducted Program Analysis of two programs i.e. BA Business Studies (BABS) and Bachelors of Media Science (BMS).

d. Internal Academic Audit

The IR/QEC department has been established to bring standardization to all academic and non-academic activities. Hence, the department regularly explores ways of further strengthening the quality of education being imparted to students. Following the department's philosophy, IR\QEC initiated a new project called Internal Academic Audit in January 2018. The project was undertaken with the aim of identifying discrepancies in the marks awarded to the students. The IR/QEC department conducted the audit for Fall and Spring 2017. Exam copies of all the campuses were assessed on the basis of the grading scheme implemented at SZABIST and evaluators' checking style. The report was submitted to VP Academics for further action.

3. Outreach

a. Relations with HEC and other Regulatory Bodies

The IR/QEC maintains close working relations with HEC and other regulatory bodies, along with undertaking assignments to enhance SZABIST's education standard. This includes: fulfillment of information provision requests, and compilation and submission of documentation. The department regularly submits information required by HEC-QAA, Chartered Inspection and Evaluation Committee (CIEC), and Knowledge and Human Development Authority (KHDA). Moreover, to acquaint staff members with latest quality assurance practices, civic and social responsibilities followed around the world, the department maintains membership with Asia Pacific Quality Assurance Network (APQN), Association of Quality Assurance Agency of Islamic World (AQAAIW) and Talloires Network.

iii. Enhancement of QEC Portfolio

SZABIST enhanced its QEC portfolio by hiring the services of QEC representatives for four other campuses. The idea was to bring standardization in the academic and administrative services across all SZABIST campuses. Also, improve the quality of the academic programs by identifying the difference between SZABIST curriculum and respective market requirement. Thus, QEC personnel across all campuses is engaged in the execution and completion of Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of their respective programs, conducting variant surveys and facilitating visits of HEC and other regulatory bodies in their campuses.

1. Islamabad Campus

The QEC department at Islamabad campus was established in September 2012. However, due to certain pitfalls, the department's operations were suspended. The department became functional in January 2015. The QEC department organized HEC-QAA Visit for Review of MS Programs on July 26, 2017. In addition, QEC attended 2nd National Level Seminar on Promoting Quality Culture in HEIs 2018 at University of Wah, Pakistan on May 10, 2018.

2. Larkana Campus

Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) started its operations at SZABIST Larkana campus in January 2015. Ms. Pooja Pohwani, QEC in charge, was responsible for assessing, improving the quality of academic and administrative operations at the campus. Also, QEC Larkana is involved in updating the Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of BBA, BSCS and MBA programs.

3. Hyderabad Campus

SZABIST Hyderabad Campus established the Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) in February 2015 and actively promoted QEC's primary function of bringing standardization to academic programs in line with the guidelines enunciated by the Higher Education Commission (HEC).

4. Dubai Campus

Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) was established at SZABIST Dubai Campus in January 2014. Prof. Dr. Hummayoun Naeem, Faculty Member, Department of Management Sciences, SZABIST, Dubai Campus, was nominated as a QEC Representative to assess and improve the academic and administrative structure of SZABIST Dubai Campus. At the preliminary phase, Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of all programs i.e. BBA, BSCS, BSMS, MBA, EMBA, MSCS and MPM were initiated by the respective Program Managers. Along with SAR activity, faculty, staff, alumni and employer surveys were conducted to develop a better understanding of the market and program requirements. Further, in the second phase, the SARs were reviewed by the respective Assessment Teams (AT). Moreover, observations of the AT were discussed in meetings coordinated by QEC Karachi. In the final phase, AT findings were communicated to the President, Vice-President, Head of Campus and concerned Program Managers for future compliance.

iv. Future Plans

The IR/QEC department plans to continue its regular assignments of executing Self-Assessment Reports, conducting and analyzing surveys, preparing SZABIST Trust Annual Report and Course Catalogue, engaging in

compilation of various analyses and so forth. Further, in light of HEC-QAA revised criteria and benchmarked universities, IR/QEC is devising new strategies to eradicate weakness at the institute and strengthen the quality of education imparted at SZABIST.

In 2018-2019, IR/QEC will be concentrating on the second round of SARs of various programs offered by SZABIST, providing support to accreditation and regulatory bodies including HEC, NBEAC, PEC, NCEAC and others, and strengthening SZABIST publications and reports. The department also plans to participate and conduct QA workshops nationally and internationally. A new survey of current students will be undertaken in Spring 2019.

IV. Board of Advanced Studies and Research (BASR)

SZABIST leadership encourages and nurtures a research-oriented culture at the Institute. Board of Advanced Studies and Research (BASR) committee was established in 2015 with the approval of Board of Trustees. The committee comprises of eminent academicians and researchers developing, reviewing and revising the policies, procedures and structure of programs and research activities at postgraduate level for the advancement of research and development. The decisions taken by Doctoral Committee (DC) and Research Committee (RC) are brought to BASR for deliberation and ratification.







i. Doctoral Committee (DC)

Doctoral Committee (DC) looks after the matters of students of MS and PhD programs in various departments. It monitors and evaluates the semester wise progress of individual students and tackles the issues of satisfactory to unsatisfactory performance, semester freezing, time bar issues, provision of approved supervisors and co-supervisors to them, getting theses and dissertations evaluated and examined by internal and external evaluators domestically or internationally from academically advanced countries, cancellation of admission, releasing notifications for award of degrees, and so on.

Recently, DC has established Departmental Ethics Review Board (DERB) and Institutional Ethics Review Board (IERB) to scrutinize all the research undertakings in MS and PhD programs from ethical consideration perspective, sequentially at departmental and institutional levels. In addition, DC discourses on the emerging policies and guidelines for compliance and accreditation of various programs pertaining to MS and PhD.

ii. Research Committee (RC)

Research Committee nourishes the research eco-system across campuses. It devises policies to incentivize research publications (in papers, books, conference papers, etc.). Recently, it has established a Plagiarism Committee across campuses to tackle the complex matters of research ethics. It has also reset the honoraria for publications and participation in national and international conferences. Under RC, the research journals are published biannually including The Journal of Independent Studies and Research (JISR) for Management, Social Sciences and Economics and the second one for Computer Science. Targets are set for improvements in research journals and securing their accreditation by international indexing agencies.

In addition, various endeavors are undertaken at departmental level for establishment of research centers and

committees, and special interest groups (SIGs), attainment of research grants, preparation of formal document of research policy, developing a financial databank of Thompson Reuters, and strengthen digital library, ZABLIS by adding more databases into it and integrating it with the intranet system.

V. Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialisation (ORIC)

i. Introduction

Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialisation (ORIC) at SZABIST was established in 2018 to provide end-to-end services for matters related to research and development, innovation, inventions, commercialization, patents, collaborations, arranging events, and research publication honorarium. The ORIC office also serves as a conduit to local, regional and federal partners to ensure research results aid the growth of Pakistan's economy.

ii. Mission and Objectives

The mission and objectives of ORIC comprise:

- Raise fund for research.
- Provide information to faculty about various available research grants.
- Link faculty and students with relevant industry.
- Help and guide on patent filing and licensing.
- Interface between faculty and the commercial sector.
- Work with patent counsel to assess patentability/ licensing.
- Evaluate markets for commercialization of inventions.
- Identify potential licensees.
- Negotiate terms of licenses.
- Assist with negotiating problematic sponsored research agreements.
- Help faculty start companies.

iii. Aim and Purpose of the Research

The research and innovation activities of ORIC are aimed:

- To drive high impact innovation, applied research and entrepreneurship.
- To transform Pakistan from the platform of SZABIST into a knowledge-based economy dependent upon innovation and entrepreneurship.
- To link research and commercialization of SZABIST with emerging and existing firms across Pakistan and around the world.
- To encourage work closely with the researchers and on-campus Incubators & S&T Park.

 To work on commercialization of research and help startups to incubate, grow, create new jobs, products, services, markets, carry out innovation and bring in funding.

iv. Facilities

ORIC provides the following facilities:

a. Research grants offered by HEC for HEI/DEI.

ORIC provides support to the faculty members in all the research programs offered by the HEC. Some of these research programs include Technology Development Fund (TDF), National Research Program for Universities (NRPU), Pak-Turk Mobility Grant and PERIDOT (Franco-Pakistani Hubert Curien Partnership (PHC)).

b. Innovation

To bring the innovation culture to SZABIST, ORIC provides support to the faculty and students through the following:

Ignite

Ignite (Formerly National ICT R&D Fund) has been created through support of Federal Government to promote research and innovation by providing research grants in three areas, viz. technical research and development, human resource development, and innovative/commercial products. ORIC intends to take advantage of this program, for its faculty and students, by cultivating industry-academia partnership through funding concrete development and research initiatives. Further, it plans to enhance the capacity of ICT Human Resource Development by facilitating industrial demand-focused human resource capacity building and R&D capabilities in SZABIST and promoting ICT related educational programs and activities.



Young Entrepreneur Society (YES) Club

Young Entrepreneur Society (YES) Club is envisioned to represent those with passion for entrepreneurship and generate awareness of the entrepreneurship concept. Currently, ORIC is organising the first seminar on Young Entrepreneur Society (YES) club. The club intends to promote the culture of innovation and entrepreneurship amongst students. Further, ORIC intends to encourage bright students with innovative ideas and, if required, connect them with the industry for funding and support.

c. Commercialisation

ORIC intends to facilitate the faculty, students and staff in commercialising their products through:

Patent Filing and Licensing

ORIC has established links with the legal team that provides support in patent filing, licensing and copyrighting.

d. Plagiarism

ORIC provides critical support to the faculty through advice on plagiarism matters. Director ORIC chairs the Plagiarism Standing Committee. The committee is in process of finalising a new draft on Plagiarism Policy for SZABIST. The aim of this policy is to apprise students, teachers, researchers and staff about plagiarism and how it can be avoided. It is also aimed at discouraging plagiarism by regulating and authorizing punitive actions against those found guilty of the act of plagiarism.

v. Research Output/Achievement

a. Supervision of Predictive Analytics Lab (PAL)

The Predictive Analytics Lab (PAL) was approved by the Planning Commission on April 2, 2018. It is established under the umbrella of the National Center of Big Data and Cloud Computing. A total sum of PKR 81.24 million have been allocated for the project of which PKR 44.11 million are allocated for Islamabad Campus, while PKR 37.15 million are for Karachi Campus. PAL is granted to Islamabad Campus to target the healthcare domain. SZABIST is amongst the 12 selected labs that have been awarded this project to provide healthcare analytics for the following 5 programs working currently under the supervision of Health Department Sindh: Expanded Program on Immunization (EPI); Mother, New born and Child Health (MNCH); Lady Health Worker Program (LHW); Nutrition Support Program (NSP) and Tuberculosis (TB) Program.

There are 4 major goals of PAL are: Building up Intelligent analytics for Healthcare, Integrative Human Resource Capacity Building, Developing Data Repositories and Proving helpful analytics useful for decision making in Healthcare. SZABIST PAL uses the data generated by the health care programs of Health, Department Sindh, Pakistan to improve healthcare quality and coordination with an increased focus on patient-centric care.

Smart Manufacturing Lab

Smart Manufacturing Lab under the National Center for Big Data and Cloud Computing (NCBC) is being developed at SZABIST, Karachi. The objective of Smart Manufacturing Lab is the seamless integration of manufacturing operation i.e.

suppliers, plants, distributors, and the products in the core concept of Cyber-Physical Systems (CPS). This Lab will make use of internet of things (IOT) i.e. network of machines embedded with electronics, software, sensors, actuators, and connectivity which enables these things to connect and exchange data, thereby creating opportunities for more direct integration of the physical world into computer-based systems, resulting in efficiency improvements, economic benefits, and reduced human exertions. This lab aims at building a laboratory of technology for development and testing of innovative technologies, methods and concepts for intelligent production throughout the product's life cycle.

b. Pak-Turk Mobility Grant

Pak-Turk Researchers' Mobility Grant Program is implemented by the Council of Higher Education (CoHE), Turkey and Higher Education Commission (HEC), Pakistan. The objective of the Grant is to develop new scientific and technological cooperation between Turkish and Pakistani higher education institutions by supporting the mobility of graduate students and academic staff. The program also aims at providing mobility grant for research projects initiated at HEIs, supported by the own institution or by other donors. HEC and CoHE will provide funding for travel and living expenses to the researchers for their approved projects. The priority areas in 2018 are Energy Technologies, Food Technologies, Sustainable Environmental Technologies, Material Science, Smart Transportation Systems, and Robots and Smart Systems.

c. Technology Development Fund (TDF)

HEC took an initiative to finance proposals of completed interdisciplinary applied research projects for prototype development and industrial value addition for technology development. The proposed funded projects would be expected to develop a product or service which would positively impact, inter alia, the economy, solve a current problem, meet a market need, utilize local raw materials, move current products up the value chain, create large scale employment.





d. Business and Innovation Support Program (BISP-2018)

BISP is a nationwide startup competition for early stage Pakistani entrepreneurs or startups having a unique business idea. Pakistan Institute of Engineering and Applied Sciences (PIEAS) and SZABIST jointly organised a nationwide event on BISP in Karachi, Faisalabad and Islamabad on April 14, 21 and 28, 2018 respectively. During the event, 5 teams of SZABIST were shortlisted for PKR 1 million startup plan. The groups are in connection with the donors for their respective projects.

National Research Program for Universities (NRPU)

In this program, creative researchers are awarded the research grants of up to PKR 20 million. Execution period of the research project is 3 years maximum and 2 proposals can be submitted by the researcher (Principal Investigator). In line with the idea of promoting the culture of research and

innovation, ORIC conducted a training activity on NRPU (National Research Program for Universities). This training activity was carried out in Karachi and Hyderabad campuses. In Hyderabad campus, the faculty from Larkana also joined ORIC for the session. The ORIC is striving to have SZABIST in the NRPU program. Therefore, ORIC is in continuous coordination with the faculty members to discuss with the ORIC team and come up with the distinguished proposals for the submission.







Licensing and Commercialisation of ZABCMS and ZABDESK

The ZABDESK & ZABCMS are in-house designed software for student, staff and faculty that is being successfully used across all SZABIST campuses. ORIC is tasked with the responsibility to commercialize the ZABDESK and ZABCMS

Implementation of Outcome Based Education (OBE) in the Mechatronics Department

The idea of implementing the OBE was initially introduced by the ORIC. Furthermore, on the directions of Vice President Academics Dr. Muhammad Altaf Mukati, the initiative of the OBE was undertaken with primary focus on Mechatronics Department in March 2018. Initially, the mapping of the courses was done and approved in the BoS and BoF meetings. The Self-Assessment Report (SAR) was drafted in close consultation with the internal stakeholders, covering the 9 accreditation criteria. It was developed by the dedicated work of HoD Mechatronics Engineering Department, Dr. Faraz Junejo and his team, and was duly reviewed by Prof. Dr. Muhammad Altaf Mukati and Director ORIC Prof. Dr. Ahmad Hussain.

ERP (SZABIST) Gap Analysis

To strengthen the back office support within SZABIST, it was decided to conduct the ERP GAP Analysis. This will assist SZABIST in comparing the actual performance with potential or desired performance. The HR, Finance, Procurement, Administration and IT departments are the primary focus in the GAP analysis activity. Three organizations were contacted to conduct the GAP Analysis. Upon several departmental visits of these organizations and discussion with them, SAP (Systems, Applications & Products) software is selected to execute the auditing task.

Analysing the aerodynamic effect of NACA 4412 with gurney flaps for domestic sized wind turbine in Pakistan

A research study is being carried out in consultation with the Director ORIC. This is primarily being done keeping in view of the energy crisis in Pakistan and the significance of sustainable and renewable energy in the country. This study is going to generate results on how the efficiency of small-sized domestic turbine can be increased. A 3-D geometry is being designed for NACA 4412 blade profile with the gurney flaps. This is going to be simulated using the wind data made available by Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD).

Recognition of Journal of Independent Studies Research (JISR-C)

The task to recognize the JISR-C from HEC was assigned on April 10, 2018. It was done by indexing the journal in various agencies and the pending issues of the journal were published. Necessary upgradation were also made on the website for the JISR - C. The meeting for the recognition of

journal was recommended for its recognition in the "Z"

CPD Course on Clean Coal Combustion Technology for power generation at SZABIST Karachi

The first Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Course was organised in collaboration with the Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC) on July 30, 2018. Dr. Ahmad Hussain, Director ORIC, and Dr. Faraz Junejo, HoD Mechatronics Department, successfully conducted the

Establishment of National Centre for Human Nutrition

The initiative was taken with approval of Madam President and Chancellor SZABIST. Dr. Kashif Ali, Head of Biosciences Department, with the involvement of the Health Department of Government of Sindh submitted the proposal to HEC.

vi. Future Plans

ORIC is striving hard to strengthen the research culture in all the disciplines of SZABIST and bring it at par with others institutions in the country and abroad. The ORIC Office is looking forward to improve the Human Resource Development Program and explore funding for establishing Research Labs for various departments at SZABIST. Special emphasis will be given to strengthen international linkages particularly with foreign universities based on joint research proposals for international funding.

ORIC will be arranging regular scientific seminars, colloquia, symposium etc. to promote the culture of interaction and sharing of scientific knowledge with researchers around the world. ORIC will work hard in promoting entrepreneurship, technology-transfer commercialization activities that energize and support the local and national economy, and promote and enhance crosscutting and multi-disciplinary research initiatives.

G New Education Initiatives

SZABIST aims to be a globally recognized institute for excellence in education, research, development, and distinction in service. Therefore, the Institute strives to continuously impart quality education in business and allied sciences. Also, the Institute is expanding its academic horizon, catering dynamic industry requirements by launching new competitive programs periodically. These efforts have augmented career opportunities for students. During the year 2017-2018, SZABIST launched three new programs, details are provided below:

1. Bachelor of Science in Accounting and Finance (BSAF)

SZABIST Karachi launched Bachelor of Science in Accounting and Finance (BSAF) in Fall 2017. The BSAF program offers advanced skills and knowledge in the field of Accounting and Finance. The degree aims at providing strong foundation for a career and graduate-level study in Accounting and Finance. Students completing BSAF will also get an exemption in ACCA modules from F1 to F9.

2. Bachelor of Science in Entrepreneurship (BSEntr)

Bachelor in Science in Entrepreneurship was also initiated in Fall 2017. The program intends to provide solid foundation on starting up and running a business, with a special focus on developing interpersonal, business communication and leadership skills.

3. Master in Education (MA Edu)

Master in Education (MA Edu) was launched in Fall 2017. The program was launched to provide students interested in pursuing a teaching career with an opportunity to specialize in the fields of Teacher Education, Educational Leadership and Management and/or Early Childhood Education.

H Students' Activities and Educational Achievements

I. Students' Activities and Educational Achievements-Karachi Campus







Limited on April 5, 2018 for promoting entrepreneurship activities and deploying funding and incubation opportunities for innovative products and software. II. Financial Assistance

Each year SZABIST facilitates its students and employees by providing financial assistance, in the form of various scholarships and fee concession.

i. Financial Assistance Provided by SZABIST

Scholarships are funded by means of the institute's funds, these include the SZABIST Need-Based, SZABIST Merit-Based, and SZABIST Board of Trustees (BoTs) scholarships. For these scholarships, the Management and

External Relations and Financial Assistance

BoTs have identified objective criteria on the basis of which financial aid is provided to the deserving students. In case of the Need-Based scholarships, the criteria are that the annual family income should be lower than PKR 900,000, and the student should have a minimum CGPA of 2.0 for new cases and minimum CGPA of 2.5 for renewal cases. The Merit-Based scholarships are awarded to students with the highest GPA in each section.

Fee concession is provided to all students, irrespective of their financial status, in a number of academic programs. This is aimed to reduce the cost of education for students in general and increase enrollment in those specific programs.

As an employer, SZABIST provides its employees the benefit of free education by waiving the tuition fee. Another form of financial assistance that SZABIST started providing to its employees in 2011 is a 50% tuition fee concession for the children of its employees.

ii. Financial Assistance Provided by External-Donor Agencies

In addition to the internal financial aid provided by the institute, SZABIST has collaboration with various external agencies which help in providing scholarships for SZABIST students such as: United States Agency for International Development (USAID), HEC Indigenous PhD 5000 Fellowship Program, Sindh Endowment Fund, Baluchistan Endowment Fund, National ICT R&D Fund, National Testing Services, and Ihsan Trust. In order to meet the specific criteria stipulated by each agency, candidates are thoroughly evaluated through in-depth interviews.


For USAID funded scholarship, eligibility criteria for application are that the student should acquire admission in SZABIST, and his/her monthly family income should be less than or equal to PKR 45,000.

The Sindh Endowment Fund requires candidates to have a Sindh domicile, and an annual family income of less than PKR 1,200,000, whereas the Baluchistan Endowment Fund requires a candidate to have a Baluchistan domicile, and 60% marks in intermediate. In the case of National ICT R&D Fund, the registration eligibility criteria entails that the applicant must have passed F.Sc. examination with mathematics and physics as a regular student from a school/college registered with NICT R&D Fund, and have acquired 60% or above marks in matriculation (science group) exam. MS/PhD students can apply for NTS Need-Based Scholarship program if they are a full time student, have a qualifying score in GAT general/subject, CGPA above 2.5 and monthly family income equal or less than PKR. 75,000. The requirement of applying for Ihsan Trust Qarz-e-Hasna Interest-Free Loan facility, applicant's

annual family income should be less than or equal to PKR 600,000 with minimum GPA of 2.00.
